Aapo Kukko: The Socialist and the Nihilist

The Socialist and the Nihilist is a graphic novel about a trip taken by two artists who are struggling with war trauma.

A middle-aged socialist poet and a young nihilist artist meet in Helsinki in the winter of 1948. The socialist had refused to serve in Finland's Continuation War with the Soviet Union, while the nihilist had left for the front as a volunteer. On a whim, they travel across Europe together in search of a working example of socialism. As a result of their journey, both the socialist and the nihilist are changed – as individuals and as artists.

The story is based in part on the lives of the poet Arvo Turtiainen and author-artist Henrik Tikkanen.
